What has been happening this week?






Neurodiversity week

This week in our assemblies we have focussed on Neurodiversity week. The Children have discussed and explored neurodiversity and neurodivergent conditions in their classes this week using a range of books, videos and activities.

KS1 read Aaron Slater Illustrator in their assembly with Miss Blackie. Mrs Caller introduced the idea of equity and fairness to KS2, thinking about how neurodiversity means that different people may need different things, using the 'Equality Vs Equity' poster below.

School Improvements happening at Brindishe Manor...

We have met with the site team again this week, who are working on school improvements to the playground shelter and training room roof. Although the project has been slow to get going, progress is now being seen and things are starting to happen! The shelter has been stripped back and a plan is now in place for how we will progress, as the wooden timbers are incredibly old and many can not be repaired. The training room roof will be replaced in sections over the Easter holidays.

It has now been agreed that the windows of the Year 4 and Year 1 blocks will be replaced shortly afterwards, this will mean that some classes will need to decant to our Art Classroom for a week long period, in order for the windows to be completed. We will update you all when we have the schedule and plans finalised.

This week we also had confirmation that the Lewisham team have agreed to replace all three sets of our children's toilets (we have a set in each of our main halls), along with our playground set! This will be a big job which will be completed over the summer holidays. I know the children will

be very excited to have new toilet cubicles for the new year!
